Day 2 – Review I Samuel 17:1-37

 - b. What was the response of Saul and all Israel?
 - c. Do you have a "Goliath" in your life at this time?
 - d. What is his/its challenge?
3. What rewards were promised to the man who would fight Goliath?
4. Why did David feel the men should be unafraid to fight Goliath?
5. How did Saul respond to David's words?
6.
 - a. Have you ever been surprised by the great faith of a young person? Give an example.

- b. What did Christ say about this? See Matthew 18:3, 4.
7. Why did David feel confident in facing Goliath?
8. What “lions and bears” has the Lord delivered you from recently that increases your faith for the future? See I Peter 5:6-10.

Day 3 – Review I Samuel 17:38-53

9. a. What armor and weapons did David take to battle?
- b. From Ephesians 6:13-17, what is the armor of God made available to us as Christians?
10. To whom did David say the battle belonged?
11. How did David cause Goliath to fall?
12. a. How did the Israelites respond to David’s victory?
- b. How do the successes of godly men affect you?
13. a. In what ways can you relate David’s Psalm 23 to his confrontation with Goliath?
- b. Which verse of this psalm will you claim as a promise for this coming week?

Day 4 – Review I Samuel 17:54 – 18:5

14. Compare Jonathan’s attitude when facing the Philistines in 14:6 to that of David when facing Goliath in 17:37.

15. a. In verse 14:7 and 14:45 who had responded to Jonathan with love and trust?

b. What are we told of Jonathan’s love for David?

c. What do you think drew Jonathan to love David so deeply?

16. In the following Scriptures, what other examples do we find of a person/persons being “knit” to another?

a. John 13:35

b. I Corinthians 4:17

c. Colossians 2:1-3

17. Compare your friendships made with those in Christ to those made with others in the world.
