The Big Idea: The “one others” of the New Testament give us clear guidance on how to develop and maintain good relationships with other believers.

Prepare: As you listen to the lesson presentation, what questions come to your mind?

Discuss*

- How do our experiences of “family” influence our actions and attitudes when it comes to our “adopted” family of God? Romans 12:10a
- What are behaviors that indicate to you that someone is more concerned about themselves in your relationship? Romans 12:10b
- Our country is becoming more and more divided over so many things. Is it really possible for us to “disagree agreeably?” Are there other teachings in the Bible that might instruct us? Romans 12:16
- How have we judged others and torn them down? How does Matthew 7:1-5 apply? Romans 14:13
- What kind of people are we less prone to accept and why? Romans 15:7
- How might the “character + knowledge/skill” formula be different in the family of God than in other areas of life. For example, which is more important to you in picking a brain surgeon? Why is character important for Christian leaders and teachers? Romans 14:14

Apply

- Are there good things from your relationship with family members you can implement in your relationship with other believers?
- What can you do to consciously seek to honor or prefer others over yourself this week?
- How can you be less divisive with those you come in contact with this week?
- List some specific ways we can build one another up, rather than tearing them down. Which one might you practice this week?
- What can you do to help others in your group and in the church feel more accepted?
- Have you missed recent opportunities to informally teach others? How might you follow up?
